Pierre Boniface 2006 Apremont

"If the breath of spring could be bottled as a dry wine, it might resemble Pierre Boniface's 2006 Apremont, a low-alcohol Alpine white from Savoie in eastern France. Light, aromatic and as citric as a just-picked grapefruit, Apremont is made from a rarely encountered grape, the Jacquère. Chill it lightly. Successive vintages could easily become perennial favorites. ~ Howard Goldberg
